Establishing PLCs: Instructional Leadership, Common Assessments Facilitation Guide

## **Materials Needed:**

- Links on Mr. Wall's Teacher Resources/PD Materials for Wed Early Outs webpage.
- Laptop and access to PD 360. Topics/Professional Learning Communities/Practical PLCs, Segments 4 & 5.

- 2. Do video reflection questions. Discuss and answer these questions together as a PLC. Please print a copy of your answers (one per PLC) and give to Mr. Wall. (15 min)
- 3. Complete the Analytical Tool, thinking "My principal" anytime you read "I." Do this as a PLC. Please give a copy to Mr. Wall. (5-10 min)
- 4. Watch Establishing PLCs: Common Assessments video on PD 360. (3:27 min)
- 5. We will not do the reflective questions or the Analytical Tool for this video. Instead, discuss and blog-comment (Mr. Wall's Teacher Resources/PD Blog) your response to some/all of the following questions (one Response/comment per PLC):
  - a. Given the makeup of our PLCs, how might members help each other develop and examine data from student assessments?
  - b. What other instructional issues/problems/tasks could be addressed by our PLCs?
  - c. Are there other ways it might be beneficial to organize our PLCs? (15-20 min)
- 6. Following discussion, record new learning and ideas/reflections in PD 360 journal. (3 min or on your own later.)
- 7. If you finish early you may:
  - a. Use the remaining time to do some exploring in PD 360.
  - b. Review your Action Plan and discuss progress/implementation
